Analyzed by ICP-OES, UV-Vis, HPLC, GC-MS and LC-MS-MS.

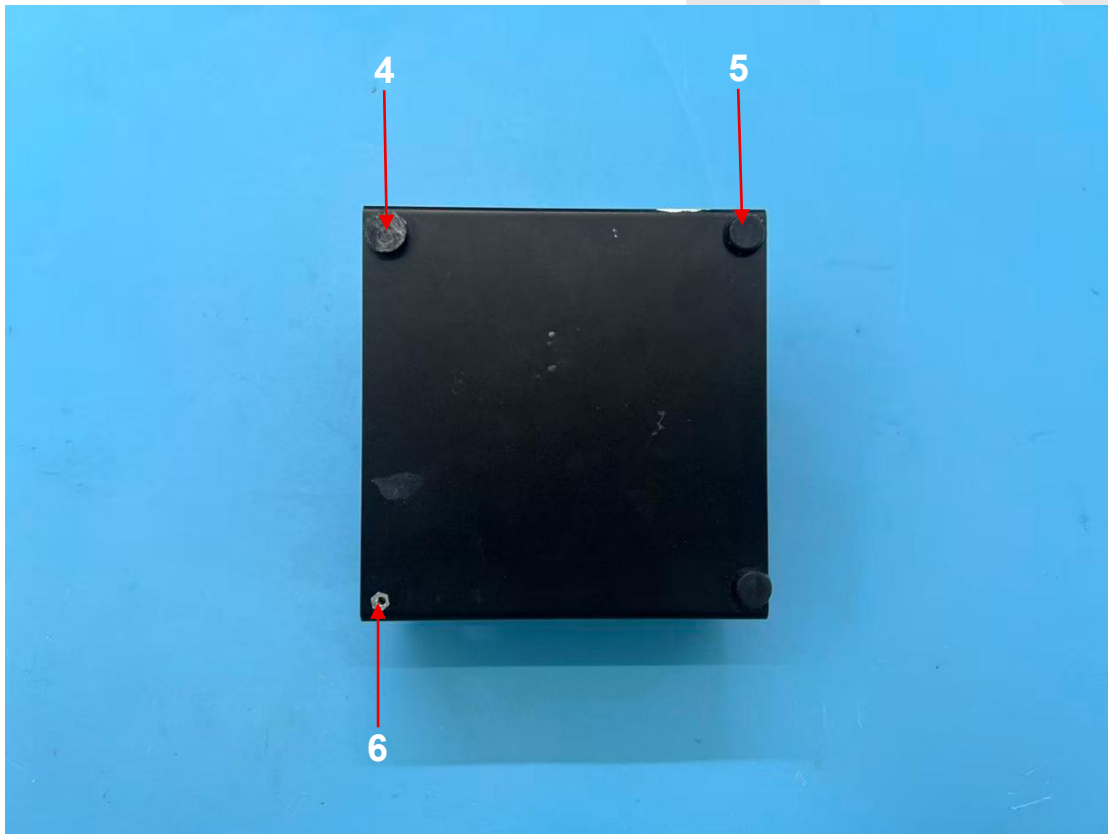
